



Education Student Accounts (ESA+) help North Carolina families of students with disabilities pay for education.

Two Levels of Funding

The base level of funding is a \$9,000 annual scholarship award. Students with certain designated disabilities may be eligible to receive a \$17,000 annual scholarship award.

Enrollment Options

ESA+ enrollment options include private school, home school, and co-enrollment.

Flexible Spending

Funds can be used for school tuition as well as allowable expenses such as educational products, speech therapy, tutoring, and educational technology.

How could funds benefit my student?

Is home school an option?

Yes! Home school is an option for ESA+ students.



North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA) is the State agency designated by North Carolina law to administer the K12 scholarship programs, including the Opportunity Scholarship and the ESA+ program. NCSEAA determines student eligibility and disburses scholarships to eligible schools on behalf of students. NCSEAA also provides program support, resources, and customer service to interested and participating families and schools.



Does my student qualify?

If your student meets the following requirements, they may qualify to receive ESA+ funding:

- Has a disability and is eligible for special education, as documented by an Eligibility Determination (a legal document issued by a North Carolina public school).
- Will be at least 5 years old by August 31 or at least 4 by April 16 and approved for kindergarten according to State guidelines.
- Lives in North Carolina.
- Has not graduated from high school.
- Has not enrolled in a college or university full-time.*

To be eligible for a higher award amount, students must meet all eligibility requirements and have documentation of a primary or secondary designation of autism, hearing impairment, moderate or severe intellectual disability, orthopedic impairment, or visual impairment.
